

# 11th Annual Lobster Bowl Regatta

September 15-17, 2023 Etchells Fleet 27 and Portland Yacht Club Falmouth, Maine, USA



# **NOTICE OF RACE**

The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the Notice of Race means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

# 1. RULES

- 1.1. This regatta is governed by the rules as defined by *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
  - 1.1.1. US Sailing prescription Appendix V Alternative Penalties will apply as described below in paragraph 10.1, Penalty System.
  - 1.1.2. The RRS changes will be described in the sailing instructions. The sailing instructions may also change other racing rules.
- 1.2. The International Etchells Class Association (IECA) Class Rules apply.
  - 1.2.1. IECA Class Rule C.5.1 will be modified as described below in paragraph 15.2.
  - 1.2.2. The IECA Class Rule changes will be described in the sailing instructions. The sailing instructions may also change other IECA Class Rules.
- 1.3. If there is a conflict between this Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions, the Sailing Instructions will take precedence.

# 2. ADVERTISING

2.1. Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority. [DP]

# 3. ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1. The regatta is open to all boats of the International Etchells Class.
- 3.2. Eligible boats may enter by completing the online registration and paying the regatta entry fee online through Regatta Management Solutions (<a href="www.regattaman.com">www.regattaman.com</a>).

#### 4. FEES

4.1. The registration fee is \$400. There is a late fee of \$50 for registering after September2. The registration fee includes launch, haul, three Saturday dinner tickets, a guest mooring for visiting boats, and all regatta activities.

# 5. LAUNCH/HAUL FOR VISITING ETCHELLS

- 5.1. Launch and haul for the event will occur at SailMaine in Portland, Maine. It is the responsibility of the boat owner/crew to launch during the scheduled time windows as the tow boats are scheduled only during this time.
- 5.2. Competitors are free to make other launch/haul arrangements to meet their needs.

# 6. SCHEDULE

# 7. MEASUREMENT

- 7.1. Presentation of a valid hull certificate and sail acquisition form (sail card) for the boat will *not* be required for this event.
- 7.2. Boat owners and any other persons in charge are reminded that a boat shall comply with RRS 78.1 while racing.

# 8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 8.1. The sailing instructions will be available online through Regatta Management Solutions (<a href="www.regattaman.com">www.regattaman.com</a>) after September 9, 2021.
- 8.2. A limited number of copies of the Sailing Instructions may be available during onsite regatta check-in at PYC on Friday evening and on Saturday morning.

### 9. VENUE

- 9.1. The Lobster Bowl Regatta will be held at the Portland Yacht Club, 40 Old Powerhouse Road, Falmouth, Maine 04105.
- 9.2. Races will be held on the waters of Casco Bay in the vicinity of the Portland Yacht

- Club. The exact location will be at the discretion of the PRO.
- 9.3. Please be advised that the Portland Yacht Club and its grounds are designated as a *No Smoking Facility*. All participants are required to adhere to this club policy. While on club grounds smoking is permitted only in private vehicles. The organizing authority will strictly enforce this rule. [DP]

#### **10. THE COURSES**

10.1. The courses will be windward/leeward with dropped inflatable marks and may include offset marks and gates as more fully described in the sailing instructions.

# 11. PENALTY SYSTEM

11.1. US Sailing prescription Appendix V – Alternative Penalties will apply.

### 12. SCORING

- 12.1. The Low Point scoring system of the RRS Appendix A will apply.
- 12.2. One completed race will constitute a regatta.
- 12.3. When five or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

# 13. SUPPORT BOATS

- 13.1. Support boats shall register with the Organizing Authority during onsite registration and display any identifying flags provided by the organizing authority.
- 13.2. Team leaders, coaches, other support personnel and support boats shall not communicate with competitors and shall stay outside areas where boats are starting, finishing, and racing, from the time of the first Warning Signal until the end of the last race of the day. Specific coach and support boat instructions will be stated in the sailing instructions. All coach and support boats shall have a working marine VHF radio onboard and actively monitor the race committee channel and assist the race committee in matters of safety as requested.

# 14. HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

14.1. All boats shall be afloat no later than 1000 on Saturday, September 16 and shall not be hauled out during the regatta except with the written permission of the Race Committee or Regatta Chairs. [DP]

# 15. RADIO AND CELL PHONE COMMUNICATIONS

- 15.1. This section supplements but does not change RRS 2 and 41.
- 15.2. All boats shall carry a working marine band VHF transceiver capable of receiving and transmitting on USA marine VHF channels 9, 16, 22A (1022 under new channel designation), 68, and 72. This changes IECA rule C.5.1.
- 15.3. The Race Committee may use the radio to provide competitors with race information on channel 72.

- 15.4. A boat that has taken a penalty or retired under RRS 44.1 shall notify the race committee by radio at the completion of that race, or in writing within the protest time limit.
- 15.5. No radio or cell phone communications or data services other than those described herein are permitted by competing yachts during each racing day from the first Warning Signal until the end of the last race of the day.
- 15.6. Boats may use the radio or cell phone to request assistance in an emergency.

# 16. PRIZES

- 16.1. Prizes will be awarded to the top 3 finishers.
- 16.2. The organizing authority reserves the right to award other prizes, including winners of individual races, or establish other divisions within the regatta.

# 17. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

17.1. Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this race participate entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The race organizers (OA, race committee, PC, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained because of participation in this event. By participating in this regatta, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.

# **18. INSURANCE**

- 18.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$300,000 per incident or the equivalent.
- 18.2. Support vessel drivers shall have valid third-party liability insurance or the equivalent and provide proof upon request by the RC/OA.
- 18.3. Each entry shall provide proof of insurance to the Organizing Authority. Documentation shall be sent to Rich Hubbell, Fleet 27 Treasurer, at hubbell.rich@gmail.com or 274 W Main St., Yarmouth, ME 04096.
