ORR-Ez Standard Course Type Decision Tree

This document describes an objective process to select a "best fit" course type for any race. Keep in mind that Random Leg is always the default "all-purpose" rating.

1.	More than 60% of the course completed as a Windward-Leeward?
2.	YES – Number of legs?
3.	EVEN – Finish downwind or mid-course upwind: <u>Use W50L50</u>
4.	ODD – Finish at top mark: <u>Use W60L40</u>
5.	NO – More than 80% spinnaker carry?
6.	YES – <u>Use Mostly LW</u>
7.	NO – Less than 20% spinnaker carry?
8.	YES – <u>Use Mostly WW</u>
9.	NO – <u>Use Random Leg</u>

NOTES:

- 1. On a Windward-Leeward course, the fleet must tack or gybe, other than at a mark rounding, on two or more legs of the course.
- 2. Percentages are by distance made good along the rhumb line of the course, not by time or by distance sailed over ground.
- 3. Where the percentages and descriptions in this document do not match those in the ORR-Ez Glossary definitions, it is with the intent to find a "best fit" course for assorted conditions.
- 4. When in doubt, use Random Leg.

SPECIFIC COURSES, BEST FIT:

Triangle, Triangle-W-L, Gold Cup, Old Olympic: use Random Leg.

All reaching, no spinnaker carry: use Mostly WW.

All reaching, all spinnaker carry: use Mostly LW.
